Inspection Details:

Conducted a work site inspection at the Yellowknife Golf Club, met with the General Manager, Mr. Matthew Gray. Discussed the various requirements and obligations as defined in the NT Safety Act and OHS Regulations.

Mr. Matthew Gray and a few other staff members had recently finished the required NT Supervisor Training Course and are currently establishing policy and procedures, and other assessments to implement an overall site safety program.

Work site orientations are being conducted and sample finished orientations were provide for review. Various types of Personal Protective Equipment were available for staff to use.

Conducted a site inspection of the Pro Shop, Club House and Maintenance Shed. Talked about WHMIS 2015 and Material Safety Data Sheets. Gave out WSCC Ladder stickers and a WSCC Thumb Dive with the new OHS Regulations on it.

Regulatory Requirements
